



# Super Special Ladies Day Out

In Milton, Wisconsin

Enjoy a light breakfast at [Charming B's Coffee & More](#), 819 E. High Street, located in Chapel Specialties, a former Methodist Church constructed in 1883. Make sure to leave time to shop. There are a variety of items for sale at Chapel Specialties, including artwork, jewelry, and other specialty items. Plan ahead and make an appointment at [The Catwalk Salon](#), [Facials by Laura](#), or [Affinity Massage & Bodywork](#), which are all located at Chapel Specialties.



Spend the morning shopping around Goodrich Square, Milton's east-side downtown district. There is consignment shopping at [Corner Closet](#), 251 Parkview Drive. [Retique'd Antiques & Consignment](#) is a store located at 237 Parkview Drive featuring antiques, repurposed, retro, primitive, and collectables. [Goodrich Hall Antiques](#), 501 College Street, is located in a former women's dormitory constructed in 1857 for the Milton College, which closed in 1982. [Goodrich Antiques & Uniques](#), 742 E. Madison Avenue, is another great place in Milton to find antiques and is owned by the same family as Goodrich Hall Antiques. It is located in the former Ezra Goodrich House. Ezra was the son of Joseph Goodrich, the founder of Milton. [Loose Threads](#), 8005 N. US Hwy 26, is located just on the fringe of the City of Milton limits and is a full-service quilt and yarn shop.



Enjoy lunch at one of [Milton's local restaurants](#).

After lunch, make the short drive over to Junction Square, Milton's west-side downtown district, and enjoy shopping at even more unique shops. The [Old Junction Mill](#), 613 W. Madison Avenue, used to be a tobacco warehouse and later a feed mill. Currently, it houses three businesses: [Red Rooster Furnishings & Gifts](#), [Pene Jenta](#) (clothing & accessories), and the [Peddler's Loft](#) featuring over 45 vendors. [InspiREd](#), 34 Merchant Row, features Retro, Rehab, and Vintage furniture and home décor consignment.



Once you are done shopping, head back over to Milton's eastside for a Wine & Chocolate pairing at [Northleaf Winery](#), 232 S. Janesville Street, and arrange for a tour of the winery. The winery is located in the 1850 former John Alexander Wheat Warehouse and is on the National Register of Historic Places. If you are interested in an additional wine tasting, stop by [Timber Hill Winery](#), 1223 E. Storrs Lake Road.



End your Super Special Ladies Day Out at the [Fredrick's Supper Club](#), 118 Merchant Row, located in Junction Square in the Hayes Block. The building was constructed in 1899 and had many uses prior to a supper club including a Ben Franklin dimestore in the 1960s.
